

**C1 C2 prep clinic January 19-20, 2008**  
**Grays Harbor Fairgrounds, Elma, WA**

Objective of clinic:

To prepare D3 and C1s for their next rating by offering mounted and unmounted instruction. Participants will learn what skills are still needed for their rating and leave with advice on how to attain them. Also, participants will meet their peers throughout the region.

Who may attend:

D3s and C1s

Adults associated with clinic attendees are welcome to watch the lessons and unmounted sessions, and volunteer as needed.

Tentative Schedule of clinic

Saturday morning, 7 am arrive, stable horse (Friday night arrival available with special arrangements)

Saturday –7:30 orientation in barn, 8:00 begin mounted and unmounted sessions, afternoon group mounted lesson, unmounted morning and afternoon, 5 pm dinner as a group with unmounted discussion, evening group mounted session (all together) done around 8:30 pm

Sunday – 7:30 participant meeting, 8:00 am morning mounted and unmounted lessons, finish around 4:00 pm and departing by 5:00 pm

Clinic Fees include (subject to change due to scheduling requirements):

- **3-4 mounted lessons**, expected to be in groups of 4-5.
- **2 unmounted sessions**
- **1 unmounted** Saturday evening discussion
- **1 mounted** Saturday evening session with the whole group
- **Bandaging** practice and critique by instructor. Present your horse to the instructor bandaged. Horses may be shared, for bandaging purposes. Conformation and lameness will also be discussed in this session.
- **Longeing** demonstration and practice
- **Food:** Saturday and Sunday Snacks/drinks and lunch and Saturday dinner. See also section on lodging.

Stabling:

Stall cards are required and must be posted before you leave your horse in the barn. Contact phone numbers (cell and motel) are key ingredients.

Stalls will be assigned. Bedding is provided with stall fee (\$15/night). Prior to departure your "stall cleaning" deposit will be returned when you have stripped the stall of all bedding and a LCPC rep has checked it. If Friday evening stalls are required, be certain to indicate that on your registration.

Trailer parking:

Unload horse and all tack/equipment at the assigned barn, where all the horses will be stabled. The trailers will be parked in a parking lot, not necessarily next to the barn. Specific location will be posted in the barn.

Food:

Snacks and lunch will be provided to clinic participants. Saturday dinner will be provided to all present. Parents and associated adults will be fed dinner Saturday in thanks for their support.

There is no commercial food service on the site (other than pop machine). You will be responsible for your own food for the following meals: Saturday and Sunday breakfast. There are restaurants in the general area.

Lodging

There are camp sites available for those who wish to camp on site. The fairgrounds charges \$15/night for an RV (no hookups) or \$10 for tent camping (will be collected at Show Office at clinic). There is also a MicroTel Inn located 0.5 miles away at 800 E Main Street, Elma, WA 98541 (360) 482-6868.

Bring (in addition to standard overnight supplies):

Longeing gear (longe line, longe whip, wristwatch, helmet, gloves)

Bandaging supplies

Regular tack and equipment for flat and jumping work

Dress warmly and in layers

Stall card

Deadline:

Registrations must be sent in ASAP due to date of event. Once the clinic fills, we will retain completed registration materials to serve as a waiting list for cancellations. Prior to the clinic we will email confirmation of your attendance, as well as additional details.

Cancellations:

Refunds may be given if we can fill the vacancy from a waiting list. If you register and must cancel, we will substitute from our waiting list.

Volunteers:

Arrival:

We expect that most participants will arrive Saturday morning. If Friday evening arrival is necessary, contact Connie Riker to make arrangements for someone to be there for your arrival.

Behavior expectations:

We expect everybody to represent themselves, their club and the national organization to the highest level and to take direction given by the instructors, the clinic sponsors and the site hosts. Any participants that fail to do so will be asked to leave.

NO DOGS are allowed in the barn, and all dogs must be kept on a leash.
