Turnout/Tack:

1. List the requirements of safe riding attire.
2. Describe your tack cleaning procedures.
3. Know 2 reasons for cleaning tack.

Conditioning:

1. Describe the basic condition of your pony. (Is he: fat, thin, in shape, out of shape, etc.)
2. Describe 2 ways to recognize whether your pony is cooled out or not.

Nutrition:

2. Know the 6 the feeding rules.
2. Explain the feeding schedule for your pony.

Stable Management:

1. Name the 5 grooming tools found in a grooming kit.
2. Identify & describe the use of each grooming tool.
3. Describe a daily grooming routine.
Include: where you begin the routine
where you end the routine
4. Describe the proper method of picking out the feet.
Include: where to stand
how to ask for the foot
how to move around the pony
5. Name & describe 4 common stable vices.
6. List & describe 3 examples of unsafe equipment
7. Tack up & untack independently.
8. Demonstrate & explain how to lead a pony in & out of a stall
(What shouldn't you do?)
9. Demonstate & explain how & where to tie a quick release knot
(What shouldn't you do?)

Parts of Pony:

1. Identify and name 15 parts of the saddle & bridle.
2. Identify and name 15 parts of the pony.
3. Name & describe at least 6 colors of ponies.
4. Name & describe the face markings.
5. Name & describe the leg markings.
6. Name & describe at least 4 pony breeds.

Road/Travel Safety:

1. List & explain the basic rules for riding on public roads in our state.
2. List 3 things you can do to make sure your pony is safe in the trailer.

Record Book:

Veterinary Knowledge:

1. List & explain 2 reasons you would have your pony checked by a vet on a regular basis.

Teaching:

Leading:

1. Be able to demonstrate & explain how to lead a pony in hand.
(What shouldn't you do?)
2. Be able to demonstrate & explain how to lead a pony making transitions
(walk to halt, halt to walk)

Foot & Shoeing:

1. List 3 reasons to check your pony's feet everyday.
2. Explain 2 reasons why the farrier checks your pony's feet on a regular basis.

Bandaging:

1. Explain 3 reasons you might bandage your pony's legs.
2. Apply with assistance, protective boots and bell boots appropriate to pony's leg.
